GREETING – PROF. DR. h.c. DIETMAR KÜMMEL

” At the end of November 1999, together with Anna Nagl, I went to the USA and Canada to try to get places for our optometry students from Aalen for a semester abroad at American optometry schools. Dr. Gunkel, then managing director of the ZVA with many international contacts, had recommended the New England College (NECO) in Boston as the “first address”. The second stop was the Optometry School at the University of Waterloo in Canada, where students from Aalen were already working on their diploma theses. And then we also wanted to take the opportunity to make contact with other optometry schools in the USA at the American Academy of Optometry, which took place in Seattle in 1999. Bachelor’s and master’s degrees were not yet an issue at all at German universities at that time. In the field of ophthalmic optometry, however, the PCO – now Salus University, Philadelphia – was already on its way to Europe with a master’s course in Clinical Optometry.

In Aalen, they were very reserved about this course.

Our first stop was Boston and we were amazed at how friendly we were received and how uncomplicated it was to be granted a place to study abroad. In the office of David Heath, Vice President of NECO, with a beautiful view of MIT across the Charles River, the subject of the PCO course came up and David Heath

spontaneously asked: “Why don’t we do something like that together?” Bina Patel and Joanne Caruso – who were present at the conversation with David Heath – brought to Seattle already a week later what should be included in a joint optometry master’s from NECO’s experience and what could be added to it from NECO. At that time, these were already all the study modules that still stand for the quality of this study program, which started two and a half years later in Aalen.

In Waterloo, we also talked about the Clinical Optometry Master from PCO and Lyndon Jones then also brought proposals for a joint project back to Seattle. However, there would have been much bigger obstacles to a partnership with the State University Waterloo than with NECO.

So it was already clear that there would be a “next step” with New England College. With Wid Bleything from the Pacific University, whom we had the pleasure of meeting in Seattle, “Master’s” was not yet a topic. Wid only got involved when our first draft curriculum was ready.

Two weeks before Christmas 1999, Anna Nagl and I came home not only with semester abroad places for our Aalen students at NECO and Pacific University, but also with the concept of an optometry master’s program, which we had not even remotely envisaged when we started our journey.

In January 2000, we began to turn the idea into a concrete course of study, which was able to start in the winter semester of 2002 with the first eight students.

Even the name of the program led to heated controversy. Our Scottish colleague at the time, Gael Gordon, literally “got the cow off the ice” with the proposal “Vision Science and Business”. It was also a stroke of luck that our friend Wid Bleything suggested including highlights of the Pacific Optometry course in our master’s degree program. Thus, in addition to the study content that was to be covered by NECO, similarly extensive study content from Pacific University was added.

The curriculum was based on the 4 pillars

- “Ocular Disease” with all the necessary basics (NECO);
- “Pediatric Optometry, Vision Therapy, Sportsvision” (Pacific);
- “Corporate Management” (Aalen)
- the “Master Thesis”.

This basic concept still stands today, supplemented by further study modules that have proven necessary and useful during the past 20 years.

Looking back on 20 successful years, we must of course also mention those without whose help none of this would have been possible. The then Rector Ekbert Hering stood by the whole thing benevolently. Michael Bauer, Vice-Rector and Head of the then new Media Centre, and



his team – above all Constanze Richter – built up the exemplary e-learning concept and we were able to acquire considerable funding for it, without which it would have been inconceivable to start the study program with 8 students. The then Chancellor Heinz Kistner was a reliable advisor and companion in all questions of financing and contract design. Pascal Cromm, head of the International Office, was able to help us with everything we needed to know about the bachelor’s degree, master’s degree, contacts abroad, etc. We also had the support of our advisors in the International Office. Not to forget our responsible advisors in the Ministry of Science – and especially Mr. Stimmler – who were particularly concerned about the success of this new master’s program. And, of course, our American friends, who were “on the mat” in Aalen from the very beginning and did and still do an excellent job in their teaching.

GREETING – DISTINGUISHED UNIVERSITY PROFESSOR OF OPTOMETRY AND PUBLIC HEALTH EMERITUS-IN-RESIDENCE

DR. WILLARD B. BLEYTHING

Pacific University, Forest Grove, Oregon, USA

It all started with a phone call in 1998 from a Pacific University optometry graduate who was practicing in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada. He was hosting a visit of an Aalen University optometry student who was doing her required clinical practicum in his practice. This call was prompted by a comment from this student visitor that Aalen University was looking for an optometric college, within the United States, with whom they could connect for some joint programs of study. My reply was “yes” – let us explore this idea further.

A subsequent meeting took place in Seattle, Washington (USA) during a national optometric congress. Professors Dietmar Kuemmel, Dean and Anna Nagl, representing Aalen University, were there along with me representing Pacific University. I had invited Dr. David Heath to the discussion, from the New England College of Optometry; this College and Pacific had worked together on the development of a similar program in Italy some time back.

Dean Kuemmel showed particular interest in offering an advanced level course in optometry terminating in the

master’s degree. The goal was to enlarge upon the current scope of optometric practice in this region of Europe, and the vehicle proposed was to be a joint degree program with optometric colleges and universities in the United States. Discussions continued and on January 10, 2000 it became ‘official’; the President of Pacific University, USA and the Rector of Aalen University of Applied Sciences, Germany, signed an “Agreement of Cooperation” document. It was now time to explore various ways for these two institutions to carry out the purpose of this agreement.

As it works out, I was going to be visiting Germany with a tour in the summer of 2000. While there, Prof Anna Nagl met up with me in Munich and whisked me off to a luncheon meeting in Aalen. A very productive discussion took place that included professors Dietmar Kuemmel and Anna Nagl along with Ms. Nina Mueller, the Aalen University student whose comment had started the whole discussion.

It was at this meeting that I was invited to do some lecturing at Aalen University. I did this, doing an elective course in Pediatric Optometry for the then enrolled Aalen U optometry students.

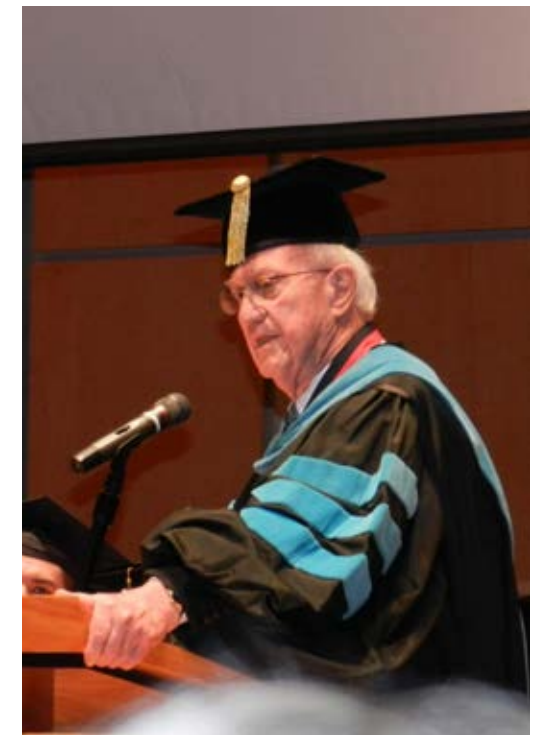
The course extended over five days, was ‘tucked-in’ between their regular semesters and took place in February and March of 2001 and again in 2002. Other Pacific U faculty taught a similar series of electives at Aalen University dating from February 2001 through November of 2002. These continued through 2003. Aalen students started to do ‘study – abroad’ visits at Pacific University with the aim of completing requirements for the Aalen U Diploma Thesis. Nina Mueller was the first to do this in August 2000 and worked with Pacific University faculty on a contact lens research project. By June of 2003 a total of 3 Aalen students had completed their diploma thesis and 5 other students had done practicum work at Pacific University.

To date, it estimated that 30 Aalen U students have spent time as a Visiting Scholar from the start of this cooperative agreement in 2000.

Planning of the MSc degree curriculum began in 2000 and was framed around three broad area of instruction: I Vision Science, II Clinical Optometric Science, and, III Business.

Elements in areas I and II were to be taught by Pacific University College of Optometry and the New England College of Optometry with the Business courses being taught by Aalen University. In June 6, 2003, a Memorandum of Agreement was signed thus documenting the curriculum content along with the relative course-teaching roles for Pacific University College

of Optometry with Aalen University. A parallel document was also prepared to indicate course responsibilities of the New England College of Optometry. While the initial Memorandum of Agreement between the three institutions was drafted in 2003, updates and revisions are done each two years.



We salute those at Aalen University who recognized the need for developing this unique graduate program of studies in optometry. Interest continues to be strong with a global audience of students being represented in each entering class; this program is making a difference in the provision of vision care to a broad range of people throughout the world.

” It is with great pleasure that I offer my congratulations upon the 20th Anniversary of the Master of Science (M.Sc.) in Vision Science and Business (Optometry) program. Clearly, the program has been an overwhelming success and the commitment of the leadership and faculty from all three institutions is evident as so many have been engaged from the beginning. I'm proud to have been a part of the original development of the program and commend the University of Aalen, NECO and PUCO for this successful endeavor.

Congratulations on the first 20 years and best wishes for continuing success in the years ahead.

The New England College of Optometry had experience in delivering Programs in Europe as we had in 1997 completed an ASIP-OD Program in Verona, Italy and had also done overseas teaching with Optometry Schools in Spain and France. They were also speaking with Dr. Wid Bleything at Pacific University and this would be a collaborative effort for our 3 schools. We met with Dean Kuemmel and Prof. Nagl and then I recall we went and had a lovely Italian dinner in the North End of Boston with them.



The program that we developed with them was that NECO would do the Basic Science Curriculum: Anatomy, Histology, Physiology, General and Ocular Pharmacology and the Premier course of Introduction to Ocular Disease with Labs that teach the students techniques such as Slit Lamp, Direct and Indirect Ophthalmoscopy, Goldman Tonometry, Visual Fields, Gonioscopy, Dry Eye techniques etc. The program was developed with the ability for our college to export our faculty to Aalen, Germany to teach these courses. The first Master's Program started in 2002 and our first class had 8 students. This has grown over the 20 years to over 25 students! Our first class of students were from Germany and Switzerland and now the Master students have been from Austria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Germany, Luxemburg, Israel, Italy, Nepal, Russia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, South Korea, Switzerland, and Thailand. It truly is an International Program!

It was an honor for me to be able to teach in Aalen in the Introduction to Ocular Disease Course and Laboratories in the First Module and to travel for the Second and Third Module also. Aalen is such a wonderful place and the Eichenhof was

so warm and friendly. We were really lucky that Dean Dietmar Kuemmel coordinated the program from the Aalen Side for many years and he would also travel to the Stuttgart airports and pick us up and bring us to Aalen. And Prof Nagl is doing a wonderful job continuing the Master's Program. The students were always very friendly and so eager to learn to be able to advance the profession of Optometry in their respective countries.

I also had the privilege to coordinate and organize and host these students for the 2-week program in Boston.



The 2-week program was filled with lectures from Optometrists and Ophthalmologists; visits and observation at Community Health Centers, Veteran Administration Hospitals, Lasik Centers, Private Optometry and Ophthalmology Practices and Polymer Technology. They had hands on Workshops in Foreign Body Removal and Punctal Plug Insertion. They were able to have lectures from Optometrist Researchers from Boston Children's Hospital, MIT, and Mass Eye and Ear Infirmary. It was a great way for them to see how Optometry

is practiced in the United States and to get exposure to a variety of lecturers in Boston. And they got to do this all in Historic Boston!

Congratulations to all the Aalen Master Students that went on this Optometry journey to increase their knowledge and skill and be better able to take care of their patients. NECO has been honored to have been able to be on this Optometry Journey with you. We hope to continue teaching Aalen Master's Students for another 20 years!!

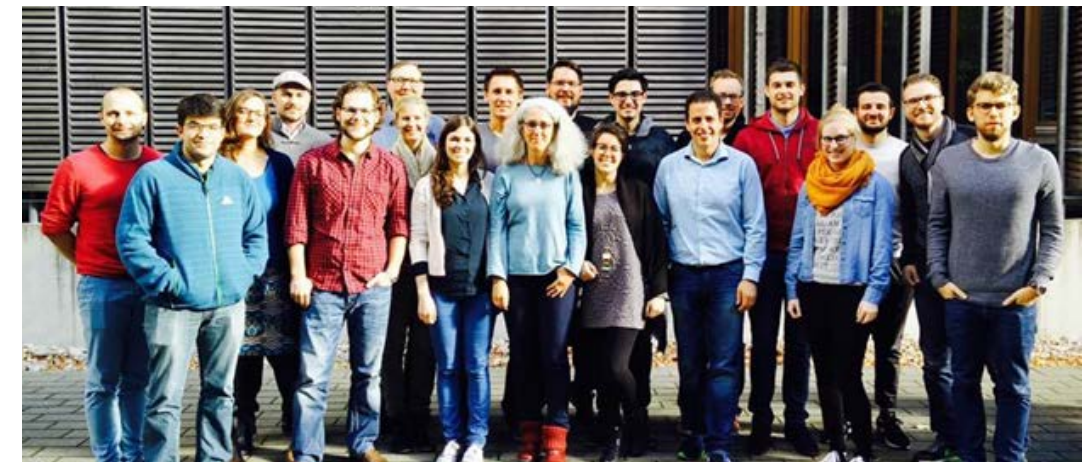

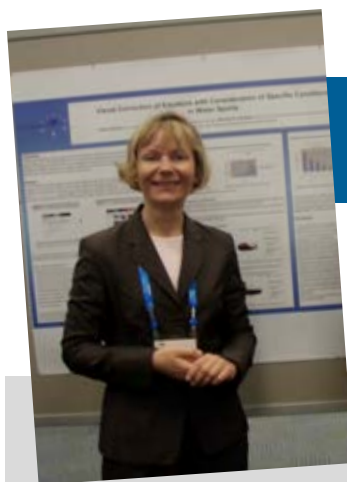

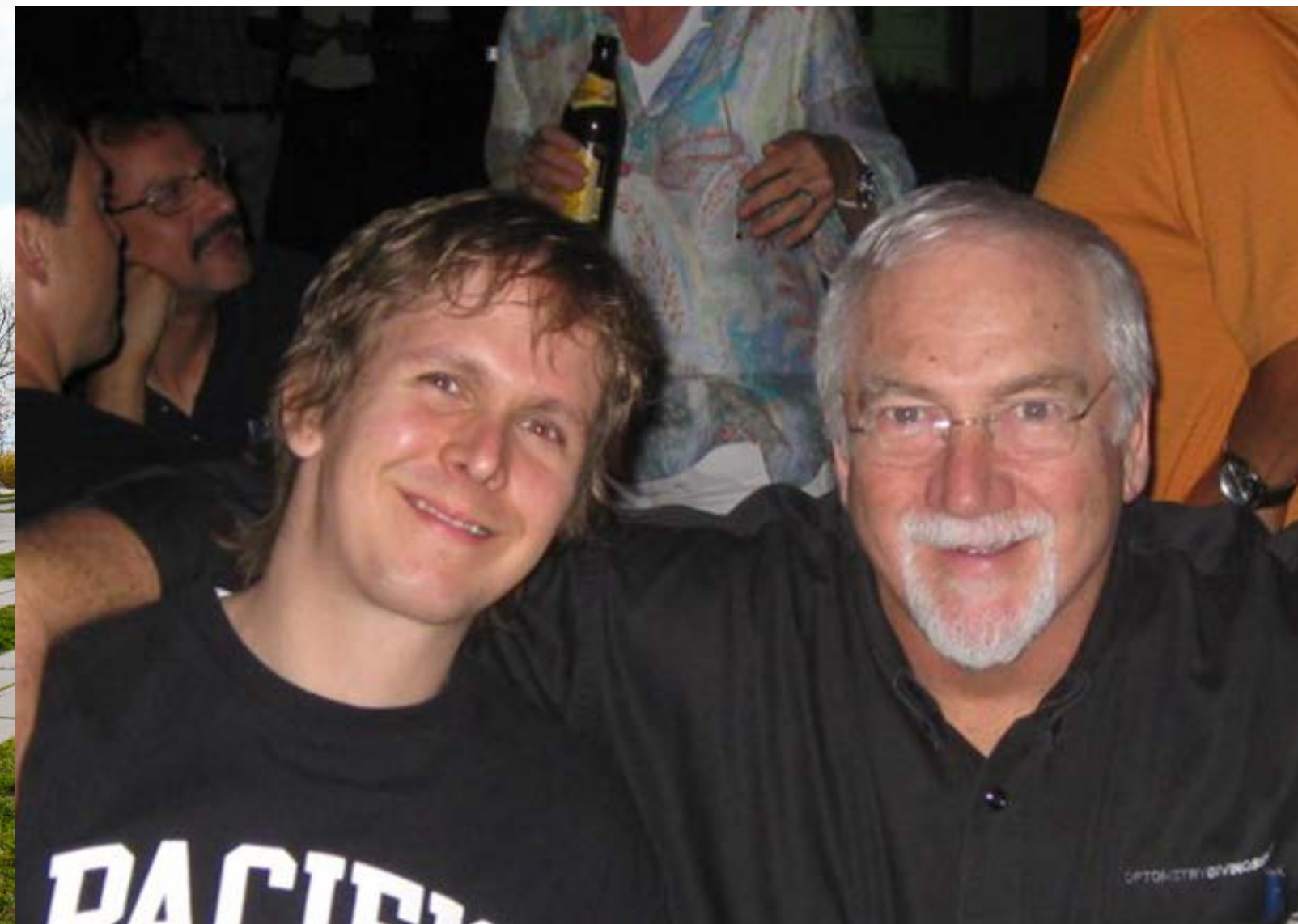
UNEXPECTED MEETING WITH BRIEN HOLDEN – MARIO REHNERT

at the invitation of Zeiss and did not miss the opportunity to follow the convivial smell of the evening and join in the student hustle and bustle.

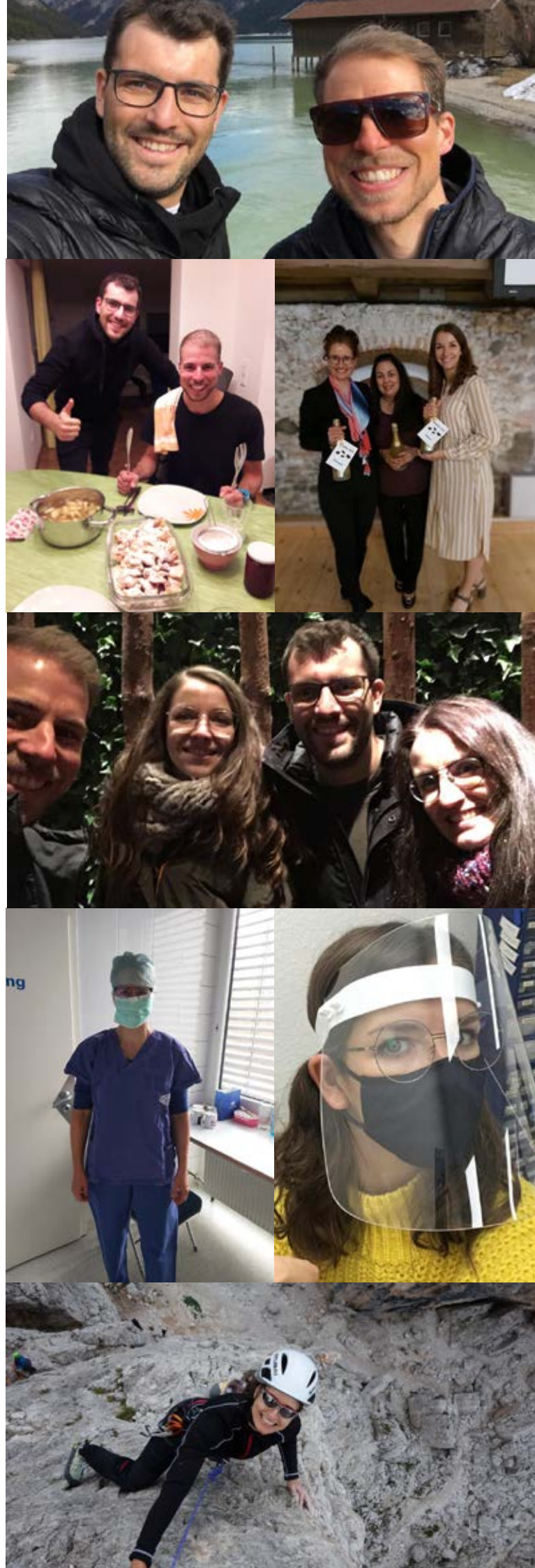

He also plays the drums for his Symphonic Metal Band INNER CORE.



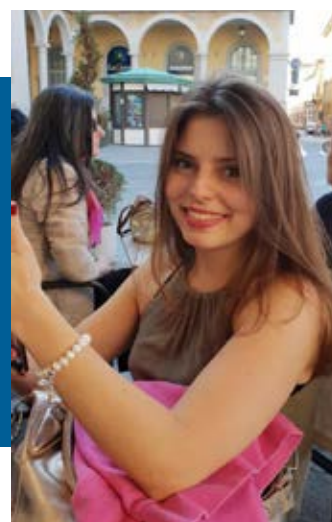
